Foreign Language

Spanish 1 PSP

0212

This course is for students who want to learn the basic structure of the Spanish Language. Emphasis will be placed on the four skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Focus will be on Spanish grammar and basic conversation skills. Class participation is essential for continued oral proficiency. Students will be introduced to the similarities and differences between the cultures of many Spanish-speaking countries and American culture.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Standard GRADE: 9-12

Spanish 1 CP

1220

This advanced level introductory Spanish course is for students who want to learn the basic structure of the Spanish Language. Emphasis will be placed on the four skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Focus will be on Spanish grammar and advanced conversation skills learned through oral practice. Class participation is essential for continued oral proficiency. Students will be introduced to the similarities and differences between the cultures of many Spanish-speaking countries and American culture.

COURSE NOTE: Prerequisite: Must have an 85 or higher in current English course

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 9-12

Spanish 2 PSP

0208

This course is a continuation of Spanish 1 and emphasizes the continued development and reinforcement of the target language in the skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Reading and writing skills are emphasized; listening and speaking skills are further developed. Grammar is more difficult at this level with the introduction of several verb tenses; vocabulary in the target language is expanded. Class participation is essential for continued oral proficiency.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Standard GRADE: 9-12

PREREQUISITE: 0212 - Spanish 1 PSP

Spanish 2 CP

2420

This course is a continuation of Spanish 1 and emphasizes the continued development and reinforcement of the target language in the skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Reading and writing skills are emphasized; listening and speaking skills are further developed. Grammar is more difficult at this level with the introduction of several verb tenses; vocabulary in the target language is expanded. Students will be able to achieve an acceptable level of fluency when participating in casual conversations. Class participation is essential for continued oral proficiency.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 9-12

PREREQUISITE: 1220 - Spanish 1 CP

Spanish 3 CP

1208

The emphasis in Spanish III is to add understanding of more complex structures present in dealing with topics and ideas more complicated than basic needs; to bring culture, history, and geography of Spanish speaking countries into closer focus; and to facilitate increasing ability to listen with comprehension, speak with greater correctness, read more rapidly and accurately and write with a variety of vocabulary and sentence structure. Oral proficiency is stressed, and there is much emphasis placed on all verb tenses.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 10-12

PREREQUISITE: 2420 - Spanish 2 CP

Spanish 4 CP

2208

Major emphasis is on communication skills. Students will be able to participate fully in conversations and will achieve an acceptable level of accuracy of written and oral expression by using appropriate vocabulary and grammar. The students will also study Spanish history and will be able to comprehend and analyze authentic texts and compose essays and write short research papers from many genres of literature. Students will also continue increasing their vocabulary and grammar structure in the target language.

Foreign Language

COURSE NOTE: Teacher recommendation required.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 11-12

PREREQUISITE: Spanish 3 CP

French 1 PSP 0404

This course is for students who want to learn the basic structure of the French language. Emphasis will be placed on the four skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Focus will be on French grammar and basic conversation skills. Class participation is required for continued oral proficiency. Students will be introduced to the similarities and differences between French culture and American culture taught through lectures, narratives, photos, and documentaries. Cultural focus will be on daily life in the capital city of Paris, France. This course includes projects.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Standard GRADE: 9-12

French 1 CP 0405

This advanced level introductory French course is for students who want to learn the basic structure of the French language. Emphasis will be placed on the four skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Focus will be on French grammar and advanced conversation skills learned through oral practice; classroom skits; and original, student-generated videos. Class participation is required for continued oral proficiency. Students will be introduced to the similarities and differences between French culture and American culture taught through lectures, narratives, photos, and documentaries. Cultural focus will be on the capital city of Paris, France. This course includes projects.

COURSE NOTE: Prerequisite: Grade of 85 or higher in current English course.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 9-12

French 2 PSP 1404

This course is a continuation of French I and emphasizes the continued development and reinforcement of the target language in the skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing: reading and writing skills are emphasized; listening and speaking skills are further developed. Class participation is required for continued oral proficiency. Grammar is more difficult at this level with the introduction of several verb tenses, and vocabulary in the target language is expanded. French drama is introduced. Cultural focus will be on French food and on cities and regions in France other than Paris. This course includes projects.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Standard GRADE: 10-12

PREREQUISITE: 0404 - French 1 PSP

French 2 CP 1405

This course is a continuation of French I and emphasizes the continued development and reinforcement of the target language in the skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Reading and writing skills are emphasized; listening and speaking skills are further developed. Class participation is required for continued oral proficiency. Grammar is more difficult at this level with the introduction of several verb tenses, and vocabulary in the target language is expanded. Students will be able to achieve an acceptable level of fluency when participating in casual conversations. At this level, French drama and poetry are introduced, and students will begin to comprehend authentic texts of prose and poetry and will begin to write in full, coherent paragraphs in the target language. Cultural focus will be on French food and on cities and regions in France other than Paris. This course includes projects.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 10-12

PREREOUISITE: 0404 - French 1 PSP or 0405 - French 1 CP

Foreign Language

French 3 CP 2404

This course is a continuation of French II. Reading and writing skills are emphasized. Focus on oral practice, sophisticated sentence construction, and advanced verb tenses. Students will learn advanced French through individual and group projects and skits. Students are introduced to French composition. Cultural focus will be on French art, literature, and music.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 11-12

PREREQUISITE: 1404 - French 2 PSP or 1405 - French 2 CP

French 4 CP 3404

This course is a continuation of French III. Includes further advanced study of French grammar, oral communication, and written composition. Cultural focus will be on French history (specifically the French Revolution and World War II), the French novel (Madame Bovary and Les Misérables), French philosophy, and French film.

CREDIT: 1 TYPE: Honors GRADE: 12

PREREQUISITE: 2404 - French 3 CP
