Jason Evans welcomed the committee and introduced Josh Williams to speak about ESSER 3.

Josh explained ESSER 3 funding and went through the 3-year plan for spending ESSER 3, including line items for the 2022 school year.

Jason began an evaluation of State Comp Ed by reviewing the SCE manual and district evaluation page. Each program was looked at and recommended for continuation or renewal. As part of the evaluation the spending for people and programs was looked at. The number of positions was reviewed for each campus along with the programs and summer school numbers. The DAC agreed to renew the programs.

The At-Risk report was given by Jason Evans. Then numbers of students and performance on STAAR was reviewed.

Mr. Evans explained that each of the people and programs that were discussed in the evaluation are the keys to the Drop Out Prevention program. The people serve the At-Risk students and the programs serve the At-Risk students. The goal of the At-Risk program is to keep students in school.

The data of the evaluation was used in the Comprehensive Needs Assessment review. Along with the numbers from campus interventions and the numbers of students using Edgenuity the DAC review STAAR performance for At-Risk students to discuss the need for math interventionist. At-Risk performance has fallen in math since 2019 at the elementary levels. Also discussed was the need to retain teachers in the district. Possible solutions included bonuses.

A list of SCE personnel and programs along with Title 1 personnel and programs was shared. The DAC was given to opportunity to provide input on the spending of these programs scheduled for the 2022 school year.

The evaluation of the Parent and Family Engagement program included the opportunities campuses extended to parents during 2021. It also review district initiatives like Facebook, Skyward Family Access, and the callout system. The committee added two items to the parent interaction list.

To complete the meeting the DAC did an evaluation of the DAC decision making process..
