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Josh Williams called the meeting to order. He welcomed those in attendance and thanked them for coming. He opened the floor for any questions or concerns. There were none.

Williams discussed the State & Federal Programs Evaluation. He noted this was a legal requirement and said the evaluation covers Title I, Title II, Title III and Rural & Low Income Schools federally funded programs. He said the evaluation tool was divided between campus site-based committees for input. Williams reviewed the Title I, Part A evaluation piece for the ECLC campus. He asked for questions. There were none.

Williams next explained the State & Federal Programs budget process. He showed members the Title I, Part A budget and noted that it is fluid and not yet complete. He then compared that budget with the Title II, Part A budget. He asked for any questions or comments. Dr. Villarino asked if the monies had to be applied for every year? Williams said that yes, the monies are applied for every year. He noted that amounts are based on Federal budgets and census data. He said that next year there will possibly be Title IV funds added.

Williams reviewed the updated campus and district improvement plans. He said that the Council would look at the plans again in the fall.

Williams discussed the new strategic priorities to align the use of Federal funds that the Commissioner is asking districts to choose one from. After reviewing the choices, he asked members to help choose one to submit. It was decided that "Building a Foundation of Reading & Mathematics" would be the district's choice.

Michael Lamb asked the council how they felt about the early end of classes this school year? Rachel Draper, Middle School administrator, said their staff felt good about it. The consensus of the group seemed to be positive.

Lamb thanked everyone for serving this year and gave a special thanks to the members whose 2-year terms were ending.

The meeting was adjourned.
